(ANALYSIS OF AMOS 3:3)

1. INTRODUCTION

Can two walk together, unless they are agreed? (NKJV)

2. MAN'S WALK WITH GOD

2.1 Covenantal Relationship: Amos 3:3 highlights the intimate covenantal relationship between God and His people. Just as two cannot walk together unless they are in agreement, a Christian's relationship with God is built on mutual understanding and obedience to His commandments. "For the Lord your God is a merciful God. He will not leave you or destroy you or forget the covenant with your fathers that he swore to them." (Deuteronomy 4:31)
